What is the "FOUR WAY TEST"?

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world's most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is "The Four Way Test", created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy. This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers. The survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four Way Test has been translated into more than one hundred languages and published in thousands of ways. It asks the following four questions:

OF THE THINGS WE THINK, SAY OR DO...

- 1. Is it the Truth?
- 2. Is it Fair to All Concerned?
- 3. Will it Build Goodwill and Better Friendships?
- 4. Will it be Beneficial to All Concerned?

For over sixty years Rotarians have been using The Four Way Test as a practical yardstick in our business, community, and personal affairs. You will note The Test does not provide answers. It asks questions which the user must answer. Thousands of Rotarians have used it and shared it with others. Millions of copies have been distributed to students and business associates. The Test has been carved into granite monuments, displayed on billboards, written into labor contracts, printed on wrapping paper and umbrellas and has been the theme of countless awards, essay and speech contests.

The Four Way Test is the key to being a Rotarian. It reminds us that we practice high ethical standards in our everyday lives. We believe that if we can promote The Four Way Test to our community and the younger generation, it will benefit all of us.



THE OBJECT OF ROTARY

The Object of Rotary is to encourage and foster the ideal of service as a basis of worthy enterprise and, in particular, to encourage and foster...

FIRST The development of acquaintance as an opportunity for service;

SECOND High ethical standards in business and professions; the recognition of the worthiness of all useful occupations, and the dignifying of each Rotarian's occupation as an opportunity to serve society;

THIRD The application of the ideal of service in each Rotarian's personal, business, and community life;

FOURTH The advancement of international understanding, goodwill, and peace through a world fellowship of business and professional persons united in the ideal of service.

What would it take TO CHANGE THE WORLD?

Rotary International is the world's first service club organization,

WITH MORE THAN 1.2 MILLION MEMBERS IN 34,000 CLUBS WORLDWIDE.

Fenimore was motivated to create an organization that helped the greater good and memorializes his grandmother, Josephine Mazza, who he never met because of breast cancer and to honor his mom Marianne Fenimore, a survivor and an inspiration.

Pine2Pink is designed to be an experiencebased non-profit that turns typical fundraising

on its ear and provides participants and donors with an immersive, visceral experience. Pine2Pink strives to inspire the entire community to engage and in doing so raise money that makes a difference in the lives of local breast cancer patients.

The people behind Pine2Pink are Fenimore's mom Marianne, his dad Ron, and his wife Kristina, all Fenimores! To learn more about Pine2Pink visit www.pine2pink.org and donate if you wish.

Outside of Pine2Pink, Fenimore serves as President of the Board for the Oscar Hammerstein Museum and Theatre Education Center. Doylestown was home to Oscar Hammerstein II when he wrote the Sound of Music, Carousel, Oklahoma, the King and I, and South Pacific. The Education Center, a non-profit, is raising money to persevere and renovate the property and transform it into a museum and theater education center.

Fenimore is originally from New Hope, PA which explains his street smarts. As a kid, he spent time on the stage at The Bucks County Playhouse. It was on that very stage during the production of Show Boat (an Oscar Hammerstein musical) that Fenimore realized his talents would be better served behind-the-scenes. This epiphany, at 8-years-old, informed a 27-year career in entertainment that he enjoyed in Los Angeles and New York.

Fenimore had had a blast, creating, producing, directing, and writing TV shows and documentaries for E! Entertainment Television, The Documentary Channel, PBS, A&E Networks, ReelzChannel, The Howard Stern Show, and others.

Fenimore currently works as a creative executive for two agencies. Sun Graphics Media, a branding and marketing company and ASGAV, a local production and live events company.

Fenimore is blessed to have two children and one wife! Kase (10), Kansas (5), and Kristina (young at heart).

In her 35 years as a museum professional, Lisa Tremper Hanover has transformed museums physically, programmatically, and operationally. Her broader role as a senior


leader in the cultural field has had a positive impact on art and history museums, humanities organizations, and other non-profit entities.

A leader in the museum field, Hanover has conducted numerous Museum Assessment Program reviews and served on AAM Accreditation teams. She retired from this position in January 2018 and currently serves the cultural field as a consultant,

In addition to presenting at numerous regional and national conferences, Hanover is an enthusiastic and knowledgeable public speaker, with presentations to over 300 regional and national organizations. She has served as President of the Association of Academic Museums & Galleries (AAMG), President of the Pennsylvania Federation of Museums & Historical Organizations and juried over 100 art exhibitions and public art commissions. Boguist also has a Master of Air Mobility from the Air Force Institute of Technology (Logistics, 2001), and has held staff positions in various Air Force, Joint, and Canadian Commands (as an exchange officer.) He holds the Bronze Star and numerous Air Force and Joint decorations, including Humanitarian Service Medals from African and Central American relief efforts. Boquist deployed to operations in several combat theaters, including Kuwait, Bosnia, Iraq, and Afghanistan. As an ardent supporter of Scouting programs in the many communities he lived in during his Air Force career, Boquist was awarded the Military Outstanding Volunteer Service Medal four times.

Boquist has completed the Wood Badge leadership course and is a four-time graduate of the National Camping School, a Leave No Trace Master Educator, and a Wilderness First Aid Instructor. Throughout his tenure in Scouting, Boguist has served on 16 summer camp staffs, including a camp in Sweden, and has held various leadership positions. He continues his lifelong community service through scouting here in Doylestown. Boquist volunteers most of his time as the Scoutmaster of Troop 71, serving to build character, citizenship, fitness, and leadership in youth.

NOT-FOR-PROFIT ORGANIZATIONS RECEIVING ROTARY CLUB OF DOYLESTOWN FUNDING IN 2020

BUCKS COUNTY CHILDREN'S ADVOCACY CENTER (THIS IS A PROGRAM OF NETWORK OF VICTIM ASSISTANCE (NOVA) (\$5,000)

Create a 'Social Story' making aids (video and printed) in English and Spanish to help children and parents relieve the anxiety of forensic interviews by preparing them with the Social Story. Funds will help provide development, production, editing, formatting, printing of the 'social story'.

BUCKS COUNTY OPPORTUNITY COUNCIL (\$5,000)

Provide funds for emergency clients to attend a 6 week course, "Getting Ahead in a just Getting-By World" to help strategize an individualized plan that leads to self sufficiency. Funds will cover class materials e.g. workbooks, flipcharts, folders, pens, markers, calculators and meals for the attendees as classes are often conducted after work or school and a graduation celebration.

IMMIGRANT RIGHTS ACTION DOYLESTOWN PA (\$1,000)

Funds will be used to purchase an onsite law library consisting of reference materials and research texts necessary for DOJ certification. The library will create a Bucks based immigrant legal referral service.

MATERNITY CARE COALITION (\$5,000)

This grant will fund two 7-week (14 session) parenting class cycles in 2020 at Libertae and the YWCA Family Center. Classes will be held twice a week for 7-weeks. Parenting classes will target at risk pregnant women and caregivers of young children.

PENN FOUNDATION (\$5,000)

Help offset costs for a camp experience at Camp Crossroads, Quakertown, PA for youth (9-12 years old) who are living with addiction in their families.

TOTAL GRANTS AWARDED \$37,500 TO INCLUDE \$3,000 IN DISTRICT GRANTS

VOICE AND VISION (\$5,000)

Funds will help publish 5,000 copies of the "Help and Hope: Substance Use-The Growing Need to Know". A 250-page resource guide for families, service providers, medical professionals, community members to help identify resources available.

LOVE QUILT PROJECT (\$500)

Change the lives of vulnerable and orphaned South African and American children, who have been affected by HIV/Aids. Provide fabric and materials to make quilt squares with supportive messages. The program engages local student clubs like Interact to make quilt squares expressing these messages. The process is used as a lesson for the students.

CHILDREN'S DEVELOPMENTAL PROGRAM (\$5.000)

Provide parents in poverty a 10-week course in child rearing; growth and development, boundary setting, anger management, etc. Funds will provide trainer, access for families to lifetime online materials

DOYLESTOWN FIRE CO (\$1,000)

Doylestown Fire Company members donate their time and talents and often risk their personal safety to protect you, your loved ones and the community. www.doylestownfireco.org

SHELTERBOX USA - AWARD TO BE GIVEN TO DISTRICT GOVERNOR (\$2,000)

This funding provides two shelter boxes to help a family with the essentials to survive in the immediate aftermath of a disaster. ShelterBox responds instantly following natural and other disasters by delivering boxes of aid to those who need it most. Each green ShelterBox is tailored to a disaster but typically contains a disaster relief tent for an extended family, blankets, water storage and purification equipment, cooking utensils, a stove, a basic tool kit, a children's activity pack and other vital items.


