The HAY Center is a public-private partnership with Harris County Protective Services providing transition services for youth aging out of foster care. What 18-year old knows how to find housing, manage their finances, make life decisions on jobs, careers, school or relationships, much less deal with medical or other emergencies? The HAY Center steps in to fill this gap with Preparation for Adult Living classes, transition housing, trained adult mentors, dedicated caseworkers, job fairs and referrals in times of emergencies. The HAY Center Foundation provides financial support for programs that would not exist but for the foundation's contributions.


