My name is Shay Shmoul, and I am the new <u>Shaliach</u> (Israel emissary) to Northwest Indiana. I am 24 years old, and was born and raised in <u>Haifa, Israel</u>. My grandparents who came from hostile Morocco and the holocaust in Hungary wished for a peaceful country that would not need an army, but are very proud of me for serving in IDF.

Last year I started my bachelor studies <u>in Tel Aviv University</u>, majoring in Neuroscience. I find the connection between body and soul fascinating and very powerful on both directions. I paused my studies to become a Shaliach, and I miss my friends from university very much. But it was for a good cause!

Israel suffers from an unflattering public image in the last few years. I would like to show the other face of my homeland. For example, the city I grew up in, Haifa is a stronghold of <u>coexistence</u> in the divided Middle East. Matter of fact, my best friend, Ram is a Druze – a member of an ethnic religious sect of Islamic origin. I met Ram in high school, and we served in IDF simultaneously. We are friends for 10 years. This special kind of friendship is possible because of the enabling atmosphere of Haifa.

Last summer, Ram and I went on a journey to the capital cities of Western Europe. I loved experiencing the different <u>cultures</u> by direct contact, and wish to continue exploring the world. My other hobbies are cycling, running, music and reading. I am a die-hard Harry Potter fan, and I owe my knowledge of English to the book series.



To conclude, I am very happy to be in <u>Northwest Indiana</u> and feel enthusiastic about starting my work as a Shaliach. I hope to make Israel engaging for the community, and make personal connections with the people I meet.
