<u>Project EXPO Tables Set-up is 7:30 AM to 9:15 AM</u> We provide the 6' table, you bring the info to share with Interactors. These will be FREE booths for Interact, Rotaract and Rotary clubs, service projects, Community Organizations, etc.

9 AM - 9:55 AM Interact Clubs arrive. Coffee & Kolaches for breakfast. Club Roll Call is at 10:05 AM - be there to make some noise!

10 AM Event starts in auditorium (Welcome, Introductions, Interact Club Roll Call, Interact Presidential Citation Awards & more)

11 AM to 1 PM 2-hour Project EXPO in the Common Area, and Lunch in the Cafeteria, plus Breakout Sessions

- A. Visit Service Project EXPO booths and leadership activities in the Common Area (next to Cafeteria)
- B. Pizza for Lunch
- C. 15-minute breakout sessions in Auditorium (examples: medical trips, human trafficking, RYE students, water projects, international service projects, Rotaract, conflict resolution, mentoring, etc.)

1 PM - Your Expo Booth material can be removed at this time or immediately after Round-Up is over.

1 PM to 2:30 PM Interactors return to auditorium for a final presentations.

- 1) How many will attend Round-Up?: 650+ from middle and high school Interact clubs throughout the Houston area
- 2) Cost to have a table: FREE! We provide the 6' table you bring project display boards, photos, etc. See Item #6 about handouts.
- 3) Projects: Showcase your club's social events, fundraisers & projects Local, International, Vocational, PolioPlus, Literacy, etc.
- 4) Booths: Have 1-2 people at your booth (they can work in shifts) so Interactors & Teacher Advisers can ask them questions.
- 4) FREE booths for local Non-Profit Organizations: Interactors are always looking for places to volunteer, or organize service projects to help. Know an organization that needs help from Interact? Send me their info: tommie5890@suddenlink.net
- 5) **Sharing of Info only**: Expo booths are for the exchange of information and not for selling merchandise or soliciting donations.
- 6) <u>Handouts:</u> Have some literature to display on the table, but you don't need to bring handouts for 700. Instead, make business-card size pieces of copy paper or cardstock with your club's name, name of service project, website, contact name, phone number and email address will be perfect...or make a QR Code and display on a poster. The Interactors can then contact you for more info. After Round-UP, Interact clubs will receive from a list of Expo booths with the project info and the contact detail AND info will be posted on the D5890 Interact Round-UP Site Page.
- 7) Interested? Tables are FREE and are reserved on a first-come, first-served basis. To reserve a free table, send an email to tommie5890@suddenlink.net to confirm. Give me the project info, contact details, etc. that I mentioned in Item# 6. We'll provide you free breakfast and pizza....just let me know how many will be attending.
