For the past 11 years Gernot has been an active participant in one (1) Matching Grant, and one (1) 3 H Grant projects, totaling approximately \$ 500,000.00 and one Global Grant for \$85,000.00. Working closely with the Rotary Club in Santa Rosa De Copan, Honduras, he has overseen the construction and implementation of water systems in 18 Villages in the areas of Copan, La Union, and Lempira, Honduras. Forging friendships and providing clean and safe water to over 5,500 people in the remote mountain villages. His commitment to these projects has made him to travel sometime twice per year, to assure the projects are constructed, sustainable and within the guidelines of the Rotary Foundation. The current Global Grant provides materials to bring clean and safe water to every ward in the hospital. The Hospital De Occidente in Santa Rosa De Copan services approximately 650,000.00 people throughout the Province of Copan and Lempira. Within the 3H grant a well has been drilled, a 2,500 gallon cistern was constructed and under the new Global Grant, piping and fixtures are provided to deliver water to showers, toilets and hand washing sinks in every Ward. Hand washing and hygiene training are a big part of the Grant that is presently ongoing and is under the observation and review by Gernot.

Gernot serves also on the Board of Thirsting To Serve, a Rotary District 6290, 501(c)3 organization that has provided over \$600,000.00 in funding for Bio Sand Filters and other water related projects thru-out the world. He also is a member of HHOP, an organization providing funding for Health and Humanitarian Outreach projects around the Globe. HHOP has funded the furnishing and installation of over 4,000 BIO -Sand Filters.

Gernot has received the Rotary Foundation's Citation for Meritorious Service and was awarded the Rotarian of the Year, from the Rotary Club of Grand Haven.
