What are the courses?

The Institute offers leadership courses in three full-day parts. Those completing each part are eligible for the next part. The courses are taken sequentially. Classes are designed to provide Rotary knowledge while developing leadership skills for use with voluntary organizations.

When and where are the courses held?

Courses are held at convenient locations within our District, though you can attend any RLI event. Sessions are scheduled throughout District 7090, with at least one taking place in Canada and one in WNY. What are the teaching methods?

- The Institute believes in course sessions with as much discussion and interactive participation, as possible.
