Directions to Morgan Park

Travel the Long Island Expressway (I-495) to Glen Cove Road; travel north. After passing intersection at Glen Head Road, Glen Cove Road is marked route 107 north. Follow route 107 north into Glen Cove by taking the left fork bypass which ends at the Glen Cove Fire Department (facing you). Turn right onto Brewster Street. At the third traffic light, turn left onto Cottage Row (Asian restaurant on corner). Go to first light, make a half left, and then an immediate right onto Landing Road. Travel down Landing Road to almost the end. Morgan Park is on the left. Turn left onto Germaine Street. The park entrance is on the right.

The Walk and Rules

This is not a race; the Walk was designed to be both challenging and enjoyable. Bring your friends and have fun. Bring your sponsor sheet & donations collected with you on the day of the Walk. Go to the registration Check-in Desk to validate your sponsor sheet and turn in the donations you have collected.

Our Cause

Explain to family, friends and neighbors that you are participating in the Gift of Life Kids for Kids 5-K Walk. Show them your sponsor sheet and ask them to make a contribution per kilometer or mile that you plan to walk. Tell them that their contribution will go to support the Gift of Life program for needy children, from home and abroad, who require open-heart surgery. Since the first Kids for Kids event in 1977, over 10,000 children from 60 countries have been operated on by Rotary Gift of Life programs. Tell them the medical professionals donate their services and the hospitals partner with Rotary to underwrite all the medical expenses for the children. The Ronald McDonald House is the "home away from home" for the children and their parents. The following are the local hospitals participating in the program.

Recently, medical missions have become an essential method for the Gift of Life, Inc. to help provide care to children who would not have any other chance at a healthy life. In the last few years, thanks to the cooperation and partnership with other Gift of Life and other volunteer and charity organizations, Gift of Life has been sending teams of professional healthcare providers to Morocco, Russia, Uganda, Palestine, El Salvador, Haiti, Jordan and other countries so that children on waiting lists in those countries could be treated in a systematic and strategic fashion. Our goal is to create partnership with other Gift of Life chapters and other volunteer and charity organizations, locally and around the world to provide care to as many children as possible. Experience shows that medical missions are the most cost-effective way to save a large number of children in one single mission.

The Gift of Life Story

The Gift of Life Inc. Program was originally initiated by Rotary District 7250 in 1975, and is today a worldwide International Service Program. Its primary purpose is to help those needy children who require corrective heart surgery secure another lease on life, through the miracle of open-heart surgery in a Gift of Life participating hospital in the U.S.A.

The program reaches out to children throughout the world, including the United States. It is a not-for-profit, tax exempt corporation whose Board of Directors and members are Rotarians of Brooklyn, Queens, and Nassau County in New York, and members of local ethnic organizations.

The concept of the Program began in 1974 when the Manhasset, NY Rotary Club responded to a request for help from the Kampala Rotary Club in Uganda. The response brought five-year old Grace Agwaru on a 5,000 mile journey from Uganda to Roslyn, NY. On November 15, 1974 she underwent a very successful four hour open-heart surgical procedure to close a hole between the two lower chambers of her small heart at St. Francis Hospital, Roslyn, NY.

IN 1975 "GIFT OF LIFE" WAS BORN

Strange as it may seem, what began as a simple response to help one small girl from a far-away country, has today developed into a very dynamic worldwide movement, involving not only thousands of Rotarians and their families, but also countless people from other community-based service and fraternal organizations, including numerous American ethnic community groups: They all have united with the primary objective of providing the "Gift of Life" to the more than 10,000 children from over 30 countries who have followed Grace Agwaru since 1974.

CHILDREN FROM AROUND THE WORLD

Children with life-threatening cardiac disorders, ranging in age from infants to eighteen years, have been sponsored by Clubs and Districts from throughout the Rotary World. They have come from such countries as Afghanistan, Azerbaijan, Belize, Bolivia, Brazil, Cambodia, Chechnya, China, Columbia, Dominican Republic, Ecuador, Egypt, El Salvador, Ethiopia, Galapagos Islands, Georgia, Greece, Grenada, Guatemala, Guyana, Haiti, Honduras, Hong Kong, India, Indonesia, Iraq, Ireland, Italy, Jamaica, W.I., Jordan, Kazakhstan, Kenya, Kosovo, Malaysia, Mexico, Mongolia, Nigeria, Pakistan, Palestine (Gaza), Panama, Peru, Philippines, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Russia, St. Kitts, South Africa, South Korea, Sri Lanka, Tadjikistan, Trinidad, Uganda, Ukraine, Uzbekistan, Venezuela, Yugoslavia, Zaire, Zanzibar, and Zimbabwe. All have been accompanied by either a parent or guardian.
