To support the **Owosso Rotary Club** stewardship of Harmon Patridge Park, a new District 5310 Grant will help the club partner with the Friends of the Shiawassee River and extend its service to the community. The showpiece of the grant will be a Stream Team demonstration day this spring at the park, which will involve the public in planting trees, learning about the environmental health of the River, and dedicating a sign recognizing the work of the club in caring for the Shiawassee River.

Since 1996, the Owosso Rotary Club has participated in an annual River Clean-Up by removing trash from over a mile of the river, including the area bordered by Harmon Patridge Park. Another major initiative of the Friends of the Shiawassee has been their Stream Teams, a volunteer water quality sampling program.

The District Grant will help purchase equipment to establish a new Stream Team for Rotary Club members and other community volunteers. At the Demonstration Day, attendees will see how a Stream Team collects valuable information on water quality and river health. Participants will have the opportunity to wade in the river, sample and identify the insect larvae and other macroinvertebrae in the river, and learn how to conduct a safe and effective assessment of river health.

As part of the event, which will be promoted to the community, four new mature trees will be planted along the river bank, furthering the Club's 100th anniversary service project and further improving Harmon Patridge Park. In recognition of the Club's past, and continuing, volunteer efforts, the Club will become part of the Friends new Adopt-a-River campaign and a sign will be installed to publicize the Club's efforts.

In total, the District Grant will provide the funds necessary to expand and recognize the Club's service to the community
