#### **Nonprofit Organizations**

#### **Commercial Service Providers**

This has included local companies like Hendrickson Tree Care, MAC Water Technologies and State Farm Insurance.

#### **Government Services/Agencies**

Kansas City Fire Department and Police Department personnel provided displays of emergency response equipment and procedures. The Kansas City Health Department and Office of Emergency Management have also participated.
