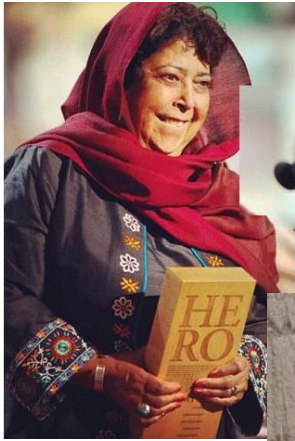

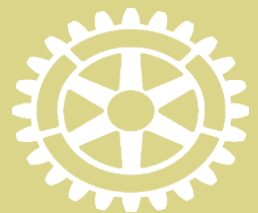
Following 9/11, Razia found her passion returning to Afghanistan to build a girls' school at the site of a bombed out boys' school. The Zabuli Center was founded in 2008.

In December, 2015, the Zabuli Center celebrated its first high school graduating class. Now Razia is building these girls a college, to continue their education and to enable them to serve their community.
